



SummerYou 2021 COVID-19 General Guidelines & Policies

Definitions

The following definitions are used in this document:

- “Close contact” is defined as someone who was within 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days prior to test specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated.
- “Symptoms of COVID-19” include, but are not limited to, fever (temperature of 100°F or higher), chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea. ([See also the CDC site information](#))
- “Physical distance/physical distancing” is defined as maintaining a minimum of 6 feet of separation between individuals.
- “Camper” is defined as any camper participating in a SummerYou camp, either on or off campus, as well as student athletes participating in Middle and Upper School Summer Strength and Conditioning.

Protocols for Screening, Isolation, & Quarantine

General

All campers, staff, volunteers and vendors entering campus buildings and leading outdoor camps will be screened for COVID-19 symptoms daily, and individuals with symptoms will be separated and sent home.

Screening Protocols

- **Passive Screening -**
 - Campers: Parents must ensure they do not send a child to camp, either on or off campus, if the child has COVID-19 symptoms (as listed in this document).
 - Staff, Volunteers and Vendors: Staff, volunteers and vendors must ensure they do not come to campus if they have COVID-19 symptoms (as listed in this document).
- **Active Screening:** [RMS Omega Smartpass devices](#) and hand-held touchless thermometers will be utilized for daily temperature checks. Every camper, staff, volunteer and vendor is required to have their temperature screened. Individuals with a screened temperature of 100°F or higher will be separated and re-screened by the nurse. Individuals who have a verified temperature of 100°F or higher will be sent home.



- Points of entry will be limited for all individuals.
 - Dillard Center for Early Childhood Education - front entry
 - Moncrief Lower School - front entry
 - Bass Middle School- front entry
 - Simpson Upper School - front entry
 - Reid Family Gymnasium – front entry
 - Martin Gymnasium – side entrance facing Moncrief Lower School parking lot
- All individuals aged 2 and over must wear a mask during screening and while entering campus buildings.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors should not enter campus or attend any camps, either on or off campus, if any of the following apply. The individual is:
 - Sick or has been sick in the past 14 days. Symptoms to watch for: fever (100°F or higher), cough, shortness of breath/difficulty breathing, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, fatigue, congestion/running nose, nausea/diarrhea, new loss of taste or smell
 - Has a confirmed case of COVID-19 or has been in close contact with a person with a confirmed case of COVID-19. These individuals must follow all isolation and quarantine guidelines from the local health authority or their physician.
 - Has a household member who is awaiting COVID-19 test results, or who is awaiting their own test results.
- SummerYou staff will monitor campers and refer them to the nurse if symptoms are present.

Isolation and Quarantine Protocols

- For individuals displaying symptoms of COVID-19 or are feeling feverish at school, the school nurse will provide a clinical assessment to determine if and when an individual needs to be sent home.
- Campers who are ill will be separated from their peers and should be picked up within 30 minutes and no later than 1 hour from the time the parent/guardian has been contacted.
- Staff, volunteers and vendors who are ill should leave campus immediately.
- Schools must close off areas that are heavily used by the individual with the suspected or lab-confirmed case (student, faculty, or staff) until the non-porous surfaces in those areas can be disinfected.
- Communication from the COVID Wellness Coordinator will be provided to the individuals who came in contact with a camper, staff, volunteer or vendor displaying COVID-19 symptoms.

Isolation

- Campers, staff, volunteers or vendors who had symptoms of COVID-19 with or without lab confirmation may return to camp after:
 - 24 hours with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medication AND
 - Symptoms have improved AND



- 10 days have elapsed since symptoms first appeared
OR
- An alternative diagnosis and note from a physician stating the individual may return to school or work.
- Campers, staff, volunteers or vendors who tested positive for COVID-19 but had no symptoms may return to camp after:
 - 10 days have passed since the positive test result AND
 - They continue to have no symptoms
- Campers, staff, volunteers or vendors who had illness other than COVID-19 (including, but not limited to strep throat, pink eye, a sinus infection, etc.) may return to camp after:
 - 24 hours with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medication AND
 - Improvement of symptoms of other illness

Strength and Conditioning Athletes with COVID

For athletic participation purposes, a student who tests positive for COVID-19 must be medically cleared by a physician prior to returning to any athletic activity including practice or competition.

Quarantine

- Campers, staff, volunteers or vendors who have had close contact (within 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days prior to test specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated (with or without a mask) to a person with COVID-19 or symptoms of COVID-19 may return to camp after:
 - Scenario A:
 - Completing a 7 day quarantine period after last close contact AND
 - Continuing to have no COVID-19 symptoms AND
 - Receiving a negative COVID-19 test on or after the 7th day of quarantine
 - Scenario B:
 - Completing a 10 day quarantine period after last close contact AND
 - Continuing to have no COVID-19 symptoms

COVID-19 Reporting

It is imperative to remain vigilant in reporting illness or close contact with COVID-19. SummerYou requests that all parents, whether parents of All Saints' students or not, report information as follows:

- COVID-19 symptoms or a positive test or close contact with COVID-19

Tarrant County Public Health

- We remain in close contact with Tarrant County Public Health. In situations not readily conforming to a category or to our existing set of protocols, we will defer to TCPH for guidance.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors are expected to wear face coverings during camp. This requirement is subject to change.

Face Coverings

Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors will appropriately wear face coverings at all times.

*Campers in Three-, Four-, and Five-Year Old Camps **Not** Entering Kindergarten in the Fall:*

- Campers will wear masks in hallways, common areas and during arrival and dismissal. Campers are allowed to remove their mask while in their designated camp classrooms.

Kindergarten Through High School Seniors:

- Campers enrolled in camps for Kindergarten through twelfth grade will wear masks while in campus buildings.

Staff, Volunteers and Vendors:

- Staff, volunteers and vendors will wear masks while in campus buildings
- Staff, volunteers and vendors may wear face shields during instruction time, which enable students to see their faces and to avoid potential barriers to phonological instruction.
- Face shields must be cleaned and disinfected after each use; they may be reused.
- Staff, volunteers and vendors may remove masks during instruction if they remain at least 6 feet away from another person and are wearing a face shield.
- All PPE required to perform job functions will be provided by SummerYou including face masks, shields and gloves for staff, volunteers and vendors. Staff, volunteers and vendors are allowed to provide their own face masks and shields if so desired.

Mask Expectations:

- Masks may be cloth or disposable; however, net, lace, chiffon, mesh, and other porous materials are not allowed. Masks with valves are not allowed. Neck gaiters are not allowed.
- A clean mask must be worn each day. Cloth masks should be washed daily. Disposable masks should be replaced daily.
- Campers may not bring masks with ties or gators.
- Masks must be worn over the nose and mouth and secured underneath the chin.



- When masks are not in use, campers, staff, volunteers and vendors should utilize a mask management device such as a lanyard or badge clip. Masks may not be set on school surfaces.
- Face shields may be worn by campers, but they will not replace mask use.
- Masks may not be shared, played with, or passed between campers.
- Campers must bring their own mask. It is recommended that parents send two masks a day in case one mask breaks or gets lost.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors will not be required to wear face coverings while eating but will be distanced 6 feet apart to the greatest extent possible.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors will not be required to wear face coverings while outside as long as they maintain physical distance of at least 6 feet between people.
- Individual needs regarding face coverings will be addressed on a case-by-case basis. Requests for accommodations should be submitted to [the Associate Director of Extracurricular Activities](#).

Protocols for Campus Visitors

Only campers registered for camps, staff, volunteers and vendors will be allowed access to campus buildings. Access to campus buildings by parents/guardians will be limited to appointment-only and will be subject to additional screening procedures and PPE requirements listed below. Visitor Screening/PPE Requirements

- All visitors will be subject to screening before entering any campus facility. Visitors are required to have their temperature checked.
- If visitors have COVID-19 symptoms, are lab confirmed with COVID-19, or have been exposed to COVID-19 they must remain off campus until they meet the criteria for re-entry.
- All individuals entering buildings will be required to wear masks at all times on campus. See [Face Covering](#) section above for age/grade specific policies.

Physical Distancing

When possible, the number of people in all campus spaces should be limited to the number that can be reasonably accommodated while maintaining a minimum of 6 feet distance between individuals.



Campers in 3-, 4-, and 5-Year Old Camps **Not** Entering Kindergarten in the Fall:

- Because of their age, physical distancing guidelines apply to the adults in the three-, four-, and five-year olds camps, not the campers.
- Campers will remain with their cohort the entire day. Staff, volunteers and vendors commit to maintaining separation between student groups, while allowing regular natural play within the cohorts.
- Campers will wash and sanitize hands often as a part of their scheduled activities.
- Campers will use outdoor space while remaining separated into their cohorts.
- Staff, volunteers and vendors will observe all COVID-19 precautions including masks, face shields, and physical distancing from other adults.
- When traveling out of their classroom, campers will be encouraged to maintain distance from other cohorts.

Campers in Kindergarten through High School Seniors

- Campers in full-day camps will remain with their cohorts the entire camp.
- Campers in half-day specialty camps may co-mingle with other campers.
- Campers will be encouraged to maintain social distancing in their classroom and when in commons spaces inside building. Movement of campers throughout the day will be minimized as much as possible.
- Classrooms desks will be set 3-6 feet apart in accordance to the [American Academy of Pediatrics guidance](#).
- Desks must all face the same direction, and seating arrangements will stay the same for the length of camp.
- Signage to direct traffic is located around campus.

Faculty and Staff

- Physical distancing is required among staff, volunteers and vendors in their work environment to reduce spread of the virus including:
- Staff, volunteers and vendors should avoid congregating.

Playground/Outside Spaces

- Campers will be required to maintain physical distancing on the playground or outdoor play and athletic spaces.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors are not required to wear masks outside as long as they remain 6 feet from another person. Masks must be put on when physical distance cannot be maintained.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors should wash their hands before going outside to play.



- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors should use hand sanitizer as they enter campus buildings after outside play.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors should wash hands when they get back to their classrooms.

Bathrooms

- No more than two people will be allowed in campus hallway bathrooms at a time.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors must maintain physical distance while using the bathrooms.
- Masks must be worn in the bathroom.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors must wash their hands after using the bathroom.

Food Service

- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors must provide their own nut-free lunch and snacks as deemed sufficient for the day's activities.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors must wash their hands before going to their designated location for lunch and wash again after lunch has ended.

Water

- Water fountains will be closed.
- No-touch water filling stations will be open.
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors must provide their own water bottles to use throughout the day. Water bottles should be taken home each day for sanitizing.

Cleaning and Disinfecting

- Avoid sharing electronic devices, toys, books, and games or learning aids.
- Limit stuffed animals and any other toys that are difficult to clean and sanitize.
- Supplies, training, and safety guidance for teachers will be provided regarding cleaning. Follow label directions for appropriate use including contact times.

Cleaning and disinfecting plan:

- Weekly: Contracted service to provide weekly deep disinfection of buildings in use utilizing electrostatic sprayer.
- Daily: Contracted service to provide daily cleaning and disinfection of classrooms, offices, and common spaces in use.
- Throughout the day: Contracted service to continually clean and disinfect common areas in use and high touch surfaces in common areas.
- Between classes and as needed throughout the day: SummerYou staff, volunteers and vendors will use alcohol and paper towels to clean and disinfect desks and high touch surfaces. Campers may also be involved in the cleaning process when appropriate and safe.



- Disinfect surfaces between uses:
 - Desks and tables
 - Chairs
 - Keyboards, phones, headsets, copy machines
 - Toys, games, art supplies, instructional materials
- Disinfect frequently (contracted service and campers, staff, volunteers and vendors as needed):
 - Door handles
 - Handrails
 - Water bottle filling stations
 - Sink handles
 - Restroom surfaces
- Areas used by any sick person should be closed off and not used before cleaning and disinfection can occur.

Backpacks and belongings

- Each camper's belongings must remain separated and in an individually labeled storage container, cubby, or area underneath a desk.
- Belongings will be sent home each day to be cleaned.

Communication

Consistent with school notification requirements for other communicable diseases, and consistent with legal confidentiality requirements, the school will notify all staff, volunteers, vendors and families if a lab-confirmed COVID-19 case is identified among campers, staff, volunteers or vendors who participate in camp through SummerYou. Medication

Nebulizers/Breathing Treatments

- Nebulizer treatments will not be administered during SummerYou 2021 unless a life-threatening situation occurs. (CDC)
- Campers, staff, volunteers and vendors experiencing acute asthma attacks should not attend SummerYou without approval by a healthcare provider.
- If an asthma attack starts at school, a campers, staff, volunteer or vendor may need a nebulized bronchodilator treatment before being sent home or before an ambulance arrives.
- Nurses will wear full PPE including gown, gloves, N95 respirator, and face shield while administering nebulizer treatment, and the minimum number of people required will be present in the room.
- Room will be cleaned and disinfected after the camper, staff, volunteer or vendor has been picked up or left the building.



Rescue Inhalers

- Rescue inhalers may be held by campers if a physician's note is provided to SummerYou staff.
- Rescue inhalers must be held by SummerYou staff if a physician's note is not provided.

Prescription Medications

- All prescription medication must be in original containers, labeled with the camper's name and dosing instructions.
